
Submission Guidelines

We invite you to submit your poetry, fiction, and creative nonfiction for the seventh issue of upstreet.

- Please read these guidelines carefully. If they are not followed, your submission will not be considered.
- We no longer take submissions by e-mail or surface mail. To submit, please go to http://www.upstreet-mag.org/ and follow the instructions for the upstreet Submission Manager.
- The submission period for upstreet number seven is from September 1, 2010, to March 1, 2011. The Submission Manager will take work only within that time period.
- The author's name and contact information should not appear anywhere on the manuscript.
- The Submission Manager provides a form to enter the author's name, address, phone number, e-mail, a brief bio, and other information of the submitter's choosing.
- Please do not submit previously published works, or more than three poems, two fiction, and two nonfiction pieces per issue.
- Fiction and nonfiction pieces must be 5,000 words or less.
- Each poem should be single spaced, and contained in a separate file. Prose poems should be submitted as fiction or creative nonfiction, not as poetry. Poems about poetry are unlikely to be accepted.
- Notification will be made by e-mail, by May 2011.

We expect the seventh issue of upstreet to appear in July of 2011. Each author will receive a complimentary copy, and will be able to purchase more copies at a special author rate.





Upstreet, based in the Berkshires of Western Massachusetts, is an award-winning literary annual containing the best new fiction, poetry, and creative nonfiction available. It is an independently owned and published, nationally distributed magazine, founded in 2005. The first six issues contain interviews with Jim Shepard, Lydia Davis, Wally Lamb, Michael Martone, Robin Hemley, and Sue William Silverman. The seventh issue will feature an interview with Dani Shapiro, author of seven fiction and nonfiction books, including the novel Black and White and the 2010 memoir Devotion.
